



GCE POST RESULTS INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE FOR CANDIDATES AND PARENTS

Summer 2019

1. When you receive your results, check first that they are *your* results by checking the name and candidate number.
2. Hopefully you will be happy with your results, however, there are key dates and strict deadlines if you need to enquire about your results and/or want access to your scripts. These are listed below:-

3. Please bear in mind that there will be a fee for both 'reviews of results' and 'access to scripts'. A full list of fees is available on the school website, and **any fees payable are to be paid in full (cheques payable to 'Borden Grammar School') at the time of requesting the post-results service.**
4. If you would like to enquire about your results, you will need to come into school to sign a consent form before we can request any review of results. Please also be aware that no exam board (AQA / OCR / PEARSON / WJEC / LIBF) will discuss results with individual candidates and/or parents.

FAQs (GCE exams)

Q1) What should I do if my grade is lower than expected and I want this reviewed?

There are services which are available to candidates, through the school, these are:-

- Reviews of Results (RoR)
- Access To Scripts (ATS) – Photocopies and Original Scripts Services

All of the above services are liable to charges which are defined by each individual awarding body and strict deadlines (above). **Candidates must also be aware that if a result is reviewed, it could stay the same, go up or go down and you should keep this in mind when considering asking for a review of results.** Further information about these services can be found on the JCQ website: www.jcq.org.uk.

Q2) What do I do if I haven't got the A-Level grades I needed to take up my conditional university place?

First of all – don't panic! There are a number of sources, including the school, which offer good help and advice. A good place to start may be the UCAS website: www.ucas.com. This website includes information about the clearing system.

Q3) When will I receive my exam certificates?

Leavers will be invited to collect certificates from the school on **Friday 10th January 2020** - invitation letters will be sent out in due course. If you are unable to collect your certificates in person you may nominate someone to collect them on your behalf by providing a signed letter from yourself, naming your chosen nominee who must also bring photographic ID with them when they come to collect and sign for your certificates.
